How low do you go?

The 2014 Directives allow for very short time limits (less than 10 days) to be applied in certain cases. But is this long enough for bidders to review your requirements and prepare high quality tenders? Will it result in fewer tenders, particularly from SMEs? Careful consideration should be given to these factors when setting the time limits.

There is a general requirement for time limits to be proportionate to complexity of a tender (Article 47).

Extension of Timescales

Under the new Directives, where significant changes are made to the procurement documents (e.g. by way of clarifications being issued) or additional information is provided less than six days prior to the tender deadline (four in an accelerated procedure), the tender deadline **must** be extended by a period which is proportionate to the importance of the information or change.
